Laurie Livingston has been making everyone laugh here at Goddard House since fall of 2021. Originally from Illinois, Laurie came to Boston to attend graduate school at Boston University and has lived in the area ever since. She became a clinical psychologist in Brookline, and adored her patients. Laurie's father, a popular doctor in Illinois,

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was one of her role models, as he demonstrated a genuine approach to caring for patients. Laurie is also proud of her time volunteering for the AIDS Action Committee in the 1980s. She visited and provided comfort to patients who had otherwise few visitors, and found a strong sense of community among the other volunteers. Laurie enjoys spending time with friends in Provincetown, or on the basketball court with The Hot Flashes, a group she and her friends formed to stay connected. She enjoys people, especially her adult child Kai who lives in Brighton. Other favorites of Laurie include her cats Ollie and Max, who are sweet (most of the time), and mint chip ice cream. The Reunion Project: New Art Show in Goddard's Gallery M

reated by Boston-based portrait artist Lora Brody, The Reunion Project is a unique multi-faceted program that combines portrait photography and the



written word to give senior women an opportunity to reflect back on their lives, who they were as teenagers, and who they are now.

Twenty-seven residents from Goddard House participated in this round of the project. The women sat for portraits, and responded anonymously to

a series of 14 prompts, sharing memories and anecdotes from their lives. Their responses are exhibited on scrolls among the portraits on display.

As described by Ms. Brody, The Reunion Project gives senior women a voice to describe their life experiences, choices, joys, heartbreaks, successes, challenges, advice, and observations. This exhibit uses photographic images

and text to create an environment that invites and facilitates reflection and meaningful discourse among the participants and their families, friends, colleagues, and helpers of all ages. You can learn more at www.thereunionproject.org.
