Her on-the-go childhood fostered an incredible capacity to be flexible, which certainly came in handy for her future career. Barbara has

had a robust life working as a nurse in a variety of contexts, including managing a unit that helped women navigate difficult OB-GYN related issues, such as child loss, adoption, and abortion. She feels immensely passionate about the field of nursing, and about who nurses are and what they do. She has three essential rules that have helped guide her throughout her life and career: 1) The trains have got to run on time. (You've got to have systems that work. You have to keep it all together.); 2) It's all about relationships; and 3) Seek first to understand, then to be understood. Outside of her career, Barbara enjoys music, nature, and spending time with her friends and her loving cat, Scotty. You're also definitely going to want Barbara on your trivia team. She holds an abundance of knowledge and you can often find her at Jeopardy busting out answers left and right within seconds.
