Fiddler on the Roof at Goddard House

n the afternoon of Thursday, June 1st, we transformed the Goddard House Palm Court into a theater to perform scenes from Fiddler on the Roof, starring a cast of Goddard residents.

It was truly a team effort. Residents, associates, and family members were a supportive and attentive audience; it was a full house! EnrichedLIFE Director Rebecca Margolin and Programming Assistants Marie Jeanty and Cherise Detwiler served as crew, assisting with props, sound and costume changes. Others pitched in as ushers and photographers, all set against the beautiful backdrop created by Community Art Therapist Meredith Griffiths. The production was dedicated to Michael Sallen, a beloved resident of Goddard House and WWII veteran who died on April 18th at age 99, one week before he was to perform as Tevye.

The rehearsal process was rewarding for the participants. The cast worked carefully to embody their characters, and Director Debra Block created a supportive environment while challenging them to communicate the deeper meaning of the story. Teamwork and creativity flourished, and there was excitement within the community leading up to the performance. Music Director Bill Sokolow brought his skill as a pianist and a great sense of humor to the process, and also stepped in to fill the role of Tevye. As director and choreographer, Debra treated the production with care and dedication, encouraging participants to bring their own expertise and interpretations to their characters, and we celebrated with a cast party following the performance. It was truly an experience to be remembered! Cast member Betty Avruch said, "I love being part of Fiddler. It's fun to be together with the residents and laugh! It puts a smile on my face. I identify with the play because it's about love and the importance of being aware and grateful for each other, and it touches my heart. It can be funny, but in the end, it's about loving each other despite the differences and the hardships, and I appreciate that."

Artist Statement

I've spent my life balancing technology and art. As a computer science major, I was the only one carrying a portfolio into class. Over the past 40 years, technology won out as I pursued a career as a user interface designer. The balance tipped in 2021, when I found my rhythm and dedicated myself to making art. Printing and collage became my keys to exploring color, shape, texture and composition.

All my pieces start by printing with acrylics on a Gelli plate on paper. Some of the pieces end up being the base of a collage; others are collage papers. I've also incorporated purchased hand-made paper, punches, rubber stamps, gel pens and oil sticks.

I feel like I have finally integrated both sides of myself. My computer background has helped me with all the 'back office' parts of being an artist. My creative side is loving using my hands again, and letting each piece reveal itself through the process.

About Layered Possibilities

Layering is essential to my work. Something on my table will catch my eye as a starting point. A few large pieces will form a base; I then cut different sizes/shapes of paper, adding and weaving them through the piece. I strive for a balance of shapes, lines, colors and a strong center of interest. I rarely start with a vision; rather the piece speaks to me as I work on it. Knowing when a piece is done is always a challenge.

This show is a compilation of work I've done over the past two-and-a-half years. It encompasses a lot of exploration of different techniques, textures, color palettes, and styles.
