Purple Flag Raising!

In February, Goddard House residents and associates recognized our recent Purple Flag Accreditation with a flag raising ceremony and celebration! Purple Flag for Dementia Care[™] standards assess an organization's ability to provide collaborative care in a safe, functional, and respectful environment to help



ensure not only quality of care but the quality of life. Accredited communities have demonstrated adherence to 60 standards of care and extensive training practices for the care of

individuals living with dementia, and have embraced and implemented a person-centered plan for all residents. Purple Flag was developed to enhance the qualities of services provided to individuals living with memory loss in Assisted Living communities, Long Term Care facilities, Home Care Agencies and other settings. It is a collaboration of the Institute for Senior Living Education, (ISLE), The CT Assisted Living Association and the CT Chapter of the Alzheimer's Association serving in an advisory capacity.
