Visits to the MFA

Each month Goddard House residents visit the Museum of Fine Arts, where we have the wonderful opportunity to participate in the Access Tours program. These tours are carefully coordinated by Accessibility Coordinator Ronit **Minchom**. Ronit begins our experience with excellent communication and attention to detail, ensuring that the entire process, from scheduling to touring, goes smoothly. From the moment we pull into the driveway to the moment we leave the building, the fabulous museum employees and volunteers are so attentive to our group. At the entrance, we are enthusiastically met by several cheerful and patient greeters who escort us inside and direct us to the waiting area to connect with our tour guides, Roe Kolanowski, Jan Schwaner, and Ruth Sherman. Roe, Jan and Ruth have thoughtfully prepared gallery destinations including American Impressionists, Art of Latin America, and special exhibitions such as Fashioned By Sargent and the Obama Portraits. Each visit features a different gallery where the guides focus on several works which they have spent time researching, sharing the artists' backgrounds, giving historical context, and asking questions to generate discussion. Roe, Jan, and Ruth have come to know our group well, considerately setting a comfortable pace that allows time to absorb and react to the art, and choosing both familiar and lesser-known pieces. Their passion about sharing what the museum has to offer always comes through! This month they will lead our group through the annual Art in Bloom event, as part of a special opportunity offered to Access Tour groups. We feel so lucky to participate in the Access to Art program! Each visit is truly a joyful, enriching and engaging experience.
