"Nurturing Community Through the Arts" Exhibition

Exhibition Showcases Artwork Created by Goddard House Residents and Participants in Five Boston-based Goddard House Community Initiatives (GHCI) Programs

relebrating the creative capacities of older adults and a culture of community-building through the arts are the dual themes of the second annual combined Goddard House and Goddard House Community Initiatives (GHCI) art exhibition, "Nurturing Community through the Arts" on display in Gallery M through May 5.

More than 30 older adults from Goddard House and five Boston-based, older adult communities convened at an exhibition event at Goddard House on April 25 to view their artwork, share their delight and gratitude for the opportunity to freely express themselves through art, and mingle with each other.

Over 100 pieces of artwork, spanning visual arts, ceramics, farming, and storytelling, were created by more than 50 Goddard House Olmsted residents and GHCI participants at programs offered at Anna Bissonnette House (South End), Mount Pleasant Home (Jamaica Plain), Hearth at Olmsted Green (Dorchester), Ruggles Assisted Living (Roxbury), and Symphony Towers (South End).

GHCI was created in 2017 to share Goddard House's creative energy, bringing the joy and fellowship of the arts to older adults living in the community.

The exhibition will move to Symphony Towers for a second community-building event on Thursday, May 9 to honor the artists and their artwork—and further gather the artists from the six communities together.
