RESIDENT PROFILE

Preston Moore joined the Goddard House community in June of 2020. He was born in Lakeland, Florida, but moved at a young age to the border of Illinois and Wisconsin. He then attended the University of Chicago Law School. After graduating,

Preston worked as a commercial trial lawyer for many years. This included work in complex commercial litigation, intellectual property such as trademarks, and International Trade Commission proceedings. While working as a partner for Morrison Foerster he became the head of the firm's international litigation and dispute resolution practice. This eventually led to Preston traveling internationally on behalf of the firm. He founded the litigation and negotiation group in the firm's Tokyo office and under his leadership it quickly became the largest American law firm presence in Japan.

After his retirement, Preston went on to become a minister and enjoyed learning about the philosophies of different religions. Always a scholar, he also spent time writing articles for different publications. In his free time, he enjoyed bicycling with his son, listening to music, and making people laugh with his quirky sense of humor. Preston is also always up for a walk or conversation with a friend.

Board Member, Dorothea Keeling. Dorothea spoke of her organization's role in developing The Pryde in Hyde Park, the first LGBTQ-affirming affordable senior housing development in New England.

The Goddard House community welcomed an intergenerational 3-person LGBTO speaker panel from SpeakOUT Boston on June 12 and learned how each managed their identity journeys in their own unique ways. SpeakOUT Boston is a speakers bureau of individuals with diverse sexual identities who interact with audiences to describe their personal experiences.

The Pride Month festivities were rounded out by the LGBTQ Film Fest, curated by Goddard House Resident John K., and the culminating Pride party featuring lawn games, refreshments and dancing with DJ George.
