Visiting Artist Program: Clay in Bloom

The Goddard House Visiting Artist Program launched in July with a "Clay" in Bloom" ceramics workshop led by Goddard House Community Initiatives (GHCI) Teaching Artist (and former Goddard House intern), Silvina Ibanez. This program aims to connect Goddard House residents with Boston-area GHCI arts programs and participants. Mary, a GHCI participant from Dorchester's Olmsted Green elder housing community, attended and enjoyed visiting Goddard House and engaging with our residents. She regularly attends Silvina's ceramics classes at Olmsted Green. GHCI was created in 2017 to share Goddard House's creative energy, bringing the joy and fellowship of the arts to older adults in the community. The Visiting Artist Program will showcase a GHCI arts program once each quarter and provide the opportunity for Bostonarea older adults in the GHCI programs to participate and meet new friends through the arts at Goddard House.

Out 2 Brunch

Out2Brunch is a monthly brunch and social for older lesbian, bisexual and transgender women. Out2Brunch is made possible by the Ethos Equality Fund, the first private fund in New England dedicated solely to supporting the development, implementation, and expansion of programs and services for LGBT elders and their support circles. Additional support comes from the City of Boston Commission on Affairs of the Elderly; the Brookline Council on Aging; Out2Brunch's host, Goddard House Assisted Living; and the LGBT Aging Project. Goddard House hosts Out2Brunch once a month during the summer.

Neighborhood Rocks, Boston's Rockin' Multigenerational Choir, performed at Out2Brunch. This group was founded by Krissy Skare (choir director) and Michael Glashow.


