## Goddard House Celebrates 175 Years

Last month, residents, associates, families, community partners, board members and government officials came together to celebrate Goddard House's 175<sup>th</sup> year as an innovative senior living organization. Goddard House is a nonprofit organization which has always been dedicated to bringing compassionate creative programming and care to its residents as well as to the greater Boston community. The oldest Massachusetts organization providing elder care, Goddard House was founded in 1849 and is named after Matilda Goddard, who was an entrepreneur and philanthropist.

At the event, guests were welcomed by classical music provided by the Brookline Music School faculty and students, a beautiful floral display by Ella Orsatti, and hors d'oeuvres passed by the Goddard House dining team. Guest speakers included State Representative Tommy Vitolo, Assistant Secretary of the Executive Office of Elder Affairs Jodi Breidel, Boston AgeStrong Commissioner Emily Shea, and the Dean of Manning College of Nursing and Health Sciences at UMass Boston Bo Fernhall. One of the event highlights was the recognition of Goddard House's staff, several of whom have served the community for over 20 years. The event concluded with food stations, a display featuring details of the upcoming building renovations, and dancing to music provided by the Winiker Brothers, who were also present at Goddard House's original opening celebration.
