LEDP Walk-a-thon Raises \$6,000+ for Olmsted Art Programs

This spring, the children and educators of Brookline's Lawrence Extended Day Program (LEDP), an after school program for grades K-6, came together to support the residents of Goddard House in a special act of community kindness.

A key part of LEDP's mission is teaching children the importance of giving back. This year, LEDP chose a cause especially meaningful to their community—especially since one LEDP staff member previously volunteered in our Olmsted Memory Neighborhood and another served as a Goddard House summer intern.

On May 21st, LEDP hosted a Walk-a-thon that raised more than \$6,000 to support the Opening Minds through Art (OMA) program and other art program initiatives in our Olmsted Neighborhood.

As part of the initiative, LEDP students took part in a hands-on OMA workshop led by Goddard House Art Therapist **Meredith Griffiths**. The session gave students a firsthand experience of the same creative process used with memory care and neurodiverse older adults. Through this interactive workshop, students built a meaningful connection to the cause they supported—while learning how creativity fosters empathy, joy, and connection across abilities and generations.

We are deeply grateful to the LEDP community for their generosity and partnership. Their efforts will bring the joy of artmaking to our memory care residents throughout the year—and have created connections across generations that we hope will continue to grow.
