Betty Avruch is a Goddard House resident and a lover of all arts. From early on, Betty was encouraged to create by her mother, whom she describes as her first teacher. At the age of seven, Betty began taking weekly art classes at Boston's Museum of Fine Arts. Around this same



time, she received a Brownie camera, which sparked her interest in photography. Betty furthered her education through a series of workshops and even set up her own dark room. These experiences allowed Betty to connect with several like-minded creatives, and for over 50 years she has participated in a photo critique group to further develop her skills and style.

This exhibit highlights a collection of Betty's works that revolve around mandalas—a symbol that has been part of human culture for thousands of years. These geometric figures have symmetrical designs that often have a center and radiate outward in patterns, which symbolize the universe's infinite nature. While mandalas may have religious meanings and are often used in Hinduism and Buddhism, they are also powerful tools for self-reflection and meditation.

Betty strives to capture the essence of the mandalanot just as a visual object, but as a deeper symbol of balance and reflection. The mandalas in this exhibit are not just representations of the visual

world; they are an attempt to explore the symmetry and harmony that exists within it. Betty says, "I hope to show how our surroundings, when observed with care and intention, can reveal the same patterns of unity, balance and interconnectedness that a mandala does. Each of these images invites you to take a moment to pause, reflect, and find your own center."

On July 24th, we celebrated a joyful milestone together—the groundbreaking of our \$16.5 million renovation and addition project. Under sunny skies and surrounded by residents, family members, associates, and community partners, we officially launched a transformation that will enhance daily life at Goddard House for years to come.

Our theme for the day was "From Vision to Reality," and that's exactly what this project represents: the realization of a bold vision to elevate how we live, engage, and age together. From a new community gathering space and expanded dining room to an upgraded kitchen, dedicated art room, and enhanced outdoor spaces, every detail is designed with residents in mind.
