## Investing in an Enhanced Kitchen and Dining Experience

Linn Foundation's \$125,000 support advances kitchen and dining renovation

We are pleased to share exciting news as our long-anticipated building renovation and addition officially gets underway. This important milestone has been made possible, in part, by the extraordinary generosity of the Ruby W. and LaVon P. Linn Foundation (Linn Foundation), which has awarded Goddard House two grants totaling \$125,000 in support of our kitchen and dining renovation.

The Linn Foundation's initial \$100,000 grant provided critical early momentum for our \$16.5 million, resident-centered renovation, specifically advancing the planning and design of essential kitchen and dining upgrades. The total cost of the kitchen and dining renovation is estimated at \$1 million, and this early investment helped position this work for success. More recently, the Foundation approved an additional \$25,000 grant to support continuity of dining services during the renovation, ensuring that when kitchen construction begins, our residents will continue to enjoy freshly prepared, nutritious meals without disruption.

At Goddard House, dining is far more than a daily routine—it is central to health, dignity, and community. Our kitchen supports our award-winning Brain Healthy Cooking program, rooted in the Mediterranean diet, and our dining room serves as a place where relationships are nurtured and well-being is sustained. The renovated kitchen will improve safety, efficiency, and workflow for our culinary team, while enhancing the dining experience for residents now and in the years ahead.

Including the Linn Foundation's generous support, we have now raised more than \$718,000 toward the overall building renovation project. We are deeply grateful to the Foundation for its continued partnership and belief in Goddard House's mission, and to all who are helping bring this vision to life. This investment strengthens not only our building, but the daily lives of everyone who calls Goddard House home.

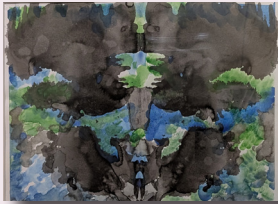
## OPENING MINDS THROUGH ART

### ARTIST STATEMENT

I was educated in Paris at the École des Arts Décoratifs as a theater designer, and have worked all my life in the visual arts. What began as a career designing sets and costumes, became a long involvement in graphic design work for public television, advertising and book publishing in the Boston area. In 2004,

I returned to the studio to pursue my passion for drawing and watercolor, first working with models and still lifes, then venturing outdoors to record the trees, rivers, ponds and shorelines of New England, California, and Provence. I want to capture nature as it changes with each passing season: the variations of the light as the day comes and goes, the racing clouds before a storm, the clear atmosphere after the rain, the reflections in a pond... I immerse myself in the landscape and try to recreate on paper the sense of energy I feel circulating and animating forms all around me. Nothing is still for very long and I must work very quickly, in concert with nature herself.
